With the support of FRLHT's ENVIS Centre on Medicinal Plants, Centre of Excellence on Medicinal Plants and Bio-Resource Information Centre on Indian Medicinal Plants Database had displayed posters on Medicinal Plants and Primary Health Care, Neighbourhood Trees of our City, ENVIS mobile App and Neighbourhood Medicinal Plants App at these stations. The information on identification of some primary health care plants with their medicinal significance were explained to school and college students, teachers and parents with live specimens near counters. Questioners on medicinal spices used in kitchen and ecological concerns were provided for students to create awareness on medicinal herbs at home and their surroundings. Information brochure medicinal plants, uses and propagation techniques were also provided to encourage the people to grow, use and conserve medical plants. Around 7,000 visitors were benefitted by these activities at Ashokapuram and Hospet. Further, these posters on Medicinal plants would be displayed in Wadi, Gulbarga District and upcoming stations.
